

The First Lesson please be seated

the readings are from the New Revised Standard Version Bible (NRSV), one of 14 Bible translations authorized by the Episcopal Church and many Christian denominations for use in worship

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Tell those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, Tell Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—Tor he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." To one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, Deginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." To they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. 



And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.

It is truly right, and good and joyful to give you thanks, all-holy God, source of life and fountain of mercy. But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Savior; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life. Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we sing:

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace. But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the +Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN**.


Sending Forth

At the + below, you are invited to cross yourself.


Let us pray.

Last Easter Storytelling Session TODAY

Quarterly Treasurer's Report

Grace Treasurer Nolan Cooper gave a quarterly review of Grace finances last Sunday. Copies of the summary are available on the Welcome Table. Some highlights from his report include:

- 2024 Occupancy Agreements with Grace tenants Onnuri Church and Holy Trinity Lutheran are updated
- Building expenses were slightly higher in March due to a quarterly insurance payment
- The Outreach account was closed, and \$32,000 from that account was moved to Reserve account for more efficient interest accrual
- Both actual revenue and actual expenses are each about one percent higher than budgeted
- Additional funds to the Discretionary account were approved by the Vestry

Discussions on CAT Survey Results Begin

Grace members completed The Church Assessment Tool (CAT) survey early in 2024, and the compiled results are now guiding discussion among members. Last Sunday, Co-Warden Wendy Manning facilitated an adult forum in the first of an ongoing effort to drill down on the results to guide the parish in future efforts and mission.

Building relationships was a discussion focus, ranging from opportunities to share meals, entertainment, or service projects. Additionally, those in attendance felt energized and responsible for developing these ministries.

There will be more discussion about enacting these priorities in upcoming adult forums. If you have something that you would like to lead, please email...insert warden email. Feel free to also speak with Pastor Amity and members of the Vestry.

The top three future priorities identified by those who completed the survey are:

Outreach: Expand outreach ministries that provide direct services to those living on the margins of society. (i.e. homeless, immigrant, transient persons)

Relationships: Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships (for example, small groups, nurtured friendships, shared meals, etc).

Outreach: Work to renew and revitalize the community around the church by building coalitions with partners that share this vision and commitment.

Stay tuned for future opportunities to discuss and understand the CAT survey.



One of the learnings from the CAT Survey is that Gracers want more time to build relationships and socialize. This summer we will offer outings and opportunities to get together and have fun.
